Actor's Workshop – Building Characters

Tuesdays, 4-6pm

Grades 9-12

This Actor's Workshop is centered on creating a character through truth and honesty. Students will work on creating believable characters through exercises, improvisation, monologue and scene work. The course will introduce to techniques that bridge themselves to the character.


Improvisation

Creative Drama

Saturdays, 9-10am

Grades 1-5

Creative Drama classes offer our youngest students an exciting introduction to performing. This class will be exploring the freedom of expression and movement while also learning to work in an ensemble. Students will learn to explore the imagination and to work as a team through basic movement, creative singing, theatre games, and performance techniques.

SPRING SESSION: April 11 – June 20

The following are 10-week classes designed to help beginners and advanced students alike.

Actor's Workshop – Auditioning Techniques

Tuesdays, 4-6pm Grades 9-12

Auditioning can be an intimidating experience even for the advanced actor. This actor's workshop is dedicated to demystifying the process, building confidence and putting the actor in control. This session will cover a wide range of topics from exploring what directors are looking for, selecting the right monologues, to techniques to help connect to the words on an emotionally honest and truthful level. Students will have an opportunity to share their work with guest artists at the end of the session. This class is designed to allow students to repeat and develop new audition material.

The Basics of Playwrighting

Thursdays, 4-6pm Grades 9-12

This course is designed to give students the foundation to create their own plays for the stage. Students will explore techniques to help them take an original idea, and develop it into a 1-act play. Exercises in dialogue, character development, conflict and structure, aw well as the reading and discussion of student work will be the focus of the class. In addition, students will be able to edit and rework their material with input from guest playwrights, Chance artists, as well as their fellow students. The course will culminate in a staged reading for the community. Students will have an opportunity to submit their work to the Chance Young Playwrights Festival in October Tuition: \$150

CHANCE THEATER and CTY Contract of Participation

In order for a student to participate in Chance Theater's CTY class, both participant and parent/guardian must agree to the following requirements:

Attendance and Timeliness: It is crucial that every session or rehearsal begin and end on time. Students must be present at every workshop session unless previously approved by staff. Should an emergency occur that would keep a student from attending a class, it is the participant's/guardians responsibility to contact Darryl Hovis, Chance Theater: darryl@chancetheater.com, (714) 343-0283 before the class is scheduled to begin. Consistently late or absent participants may be dismissed from the program altogether.

Cell Phone Usage: Cell phones must be turned off during all workshops/rehearsals. Students will be given regular breaks to check in with their messages should a parent/guardian be trying to reach his or her student. All calls must be made during those breaks.

Illegal Activity: The Chance Theater maintains a zero tolerance policy towards all illegal activities, including drug or alcohol use, threats of any kind and carried weapons. Any student participating in such activities will be dismissed from the program.

Materials and Dress: Students are required to bring their materials with them to all workshops/classes. This includes a notebook, a pencil, scripts and any other expressly stated items. Students should be dressed to move at all times. This includes comfortable, closed toed shoes, hair off of the face, and comfortable, modest, and cool clothing.

Respect: It is expected that all students respect themselves, each other, the space, and all staff, members, and volunteers of the Chance Theater while participating in this program. Profanity is unacceptable at all times. If a participant is disrespectful of/to any of the above it is grounds for dismissal.

Snacks: No food, sodas, energy drinks, or Gatorade type drinks are permitted during workshop sessions or rehearsals. Students may bring these things with them (keeping them closed and/or put away) and eat or drink them on breaks (unless a confirmed medical condition exists). Students may bring their own water bottles if necessary and water is available at the Chance Theater.
