# Chance Theater proudly announces its **2016 Season of shows**

#### Anaheim's official resident theater announces next year's line-up: 4-Show Season 18 Series, 3-Show Theater for Young Audiences (TYA) Series 2-Show Holiday Series, and a 6-Show OTR New Works Series

January 14, 2016 ... Anaheim, California ... Chance Theater is thrilled to announce its lineup for 2016, which will be the second to employ both stages in its new home at the Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center, and feature nine fully-staged productions, two workshop productions, and four readings.

On November 14, it was announced at Chance Theater's Season Preview Bash that the 50-seat second stage, which opened March of this year, will be renamed the **Fyda-Mar Stage** in honor of board member Mary Kay Fyda-Mar who contributed over \$70,000 to the "Bold New Home" Capital Campaign. It was previously announced that Chance Theater's Main Stage will henceforth be known as the **Cripe Stage**, in honor of Sophie & Larry Cripe who contributed over \$100,000 to the capital campaign.

#### **RESIDENT PLAYWRIGHT**

Chance Theater is excited to announce that our 2016 resident playwright will be **Jenny Connell Davis**, who *The Dragon Play* was featured earlier this year at the Chance. Jenny's plays have been developed and/or produced with The Playwrights Center, ScriptWorks, SPACE at Ryder Farm, Ars Nova, NAATCO, Theater MITU, Articulate Theatre, New York Stage and Film, Shrewd Productions, and The Gift Theatre, among others. She has been a finalist or semi-finalist for the Heideman, PlayPenn, Seven Devils, BAPF, the Nicholl Fellowship and the O'Neill.

"We're thrilled to have Jenny Connell Davis join the Chance family," said Literary Manager Jennifer Ruckman. "Her writing is lyrical, clever, breathtaking, and funny all at the same time. She loves to ask tough questions that leave the audience talking long after the show is over - exactly the kind of storytelling we love to bring to our stages!" (more)

In 2016, Jenny will have two plays receive staged readings and one will receive a LAB Workshop. The LAB is a recent addition to the On The Radar program, designed for stories that are further in the developmental process. They receive more rehearsal time and multiple performances, with time in between to allow for fine tuning based on audience response. Prior resident playwrights Lauren Yee and Adam Szymkowicz will also have works showcased in 2016.

#### SEASON SPONSORS

For the first time, a pair of patrons have stepped forward to sponsor the entire 2016 Season... Wylie & Bette Aitken. The Aitkens played an integral role in helping the Chance move into its new home by contributing a major gift of \$250,000 to name the building the "Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center." In October, Wylie and Bette were honored by Arts OC with the 2015 Helena Modjeska Cultural Legacy Award for Outstanding Arts Patron. Wylie served for five years on the California Arts Council, including two years as Chair. He also served previously as President of the Board of Trustees of South Coast Repertory, and currently serves on the Board of Segerstrom Center for the Arts. Bette currently serves on the Board of Directors of MUZEO and Chance Theater. The entire Board, staff, and resident company of the Chance is very grateful to the Aitkens for the generosity they have shown over the years, and are proud to have them as their first-ever Season Sponsors.
