Spectrum 'Speak Up' Series

High-functioning students on the Autism Spectrum will work together this summer to present an original piece of theater and find their voice

Anaheim, CA | February 15, 2018 ... The Orange County Asperger's Support Group (OCASG) and Chance Theater will be working together this summer to present the new Spectrum 'Speak Up' Series. The program is specifically designed for teens that have been diagnosed with high functioning Autism, Asperger's, or PDD-NOS.

For over a decade, Chance Theater has worked with local junior high and high school students to "speak up" about their lives and experiences in the 'Speak Up – Take a Chance' summer program. Through story circles, improv games, and writing exercises, students learn the fundamentals of storytelling, have a ton of fun, and find their voice. Over five weeks, they work collaboratively with their peers to write, design, and perform a new play that highlights special moments in their lives.

Through this partnership, OCASG and Chance Theater will work to modify the 'Speak Up' program for teens who have been diagnosed with high functioning Autism, Asperger's or PDD-NOS. To assist, OCASG and the Chance Theater have enlisted Dr. Asha Bhakta, president of Creative Solutions for Hope, a services organization who apply the principles and methodologies of applied behavior analysis (ABA) to create individualized instruction and "programming" geared to benefit children with developmental disabilities such as Autism Spectrum disorder and ADHD.

"OCASG is thrilled to be working with the Chance," said Judi Uttal, president of OCASG. "Teens who have been diagnosed with ASD struggle with bullying and establishing their identity during their high school years because of their social and communication deficiencies. We think that the Spectrum 'Speak Up' Program will give these individuals an opportunity to develop confidence, enhance their communication skills, and develop friendships by leveraging theater techniques." "We believe that theater can change lives," said Founding Artist Casey Long. "We are grateful to OCASG for the opportunity to expand our 'Speak Up' program to an overlooked segment of our community, and aid in developing the skill of self-expression for students on the Autism spectrum. We have seen again and again with teenagers and veterans the personal impact that is possible when you give someone a voice and a stage to speak up about their experiences. Theater is a powerful tool in realizing the potential of living a more fully rounded life by developing skills in problem solving, critical and creative thinking, and dealing with ambiguity and complexity. We can't wait to get started and see what they have to say."

OCASG and Chance Theater will jointly fund the five-week program. As part of the fundraising efforts, Chance Theater will donate up to 30% of tickets purchased for upcoming performances of James and The Giant Peach at their theater, when individuals provide a specific code.
