# Chance Theater proudly announces its 20th Anniversary Season: A Season in Search of Truth

### Anaheim's Official Resident Theater announces its 20th line-up: 5-Show Main Series, 2-Show TYA Family Series, 1 Show for Holiday Literature Series, and a 5-Show OTR New Works Series

January 4, 2018 ... Anaheim, California ... Chance Theater is thrilled to announce its 20th Anniversary Season, which will be the fourth to employ both stages in its home at the Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center. Next year will feature eight fully-staged productions, and two workshops and three staged readings of new plays still in development.

It has been an exciting journey since 1999, when a handful of young artists opened their first theater on La Palma Avenue in Anaheim. The founders believed that theatergoers deserved an alternative theater experience -- one that would focus on local artists, new plays, and strengthening community through the impact of live theater.

Almost 20 seasons later, Chance Theater has:

- Produced 156 plays and musicals, including 39 world premieres and an additional 59 regional premieres.
- Been named the Official Resident Theater of Anaheim by the City Council.
- Partnered with seven Resident Playwrights (eight, counting 2018) who represented emerging voices in the American Theater landscape, and worked with them on the development of their newest stories. These partnerships have resulted in award-winning productions at the Chance, as well as world premieres at theaters across the country, including Lincoln Center and Manhattan Theatre Club.
- Developed and maintained a Resident Company of local artists who are committed to supporting the Chance's mission of creating a more connected, compassionate, and creative community.
- Produced the first "Relaxed Performance" initiative in Orange County. Done in conjunction with our TYA Family Series, these performances are designed to make theater accessible to children and adults on the Autism

Spectrum, or who deal with sensory and communication disorders, or a learning disability. Because we have always believed that theater should be for everyone.

- Opened the Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center after completing a \$900,000 capital campaign. The venue has given our audiences a better theatergoing experience, allowed us to expand our education programs, and expand our programming due to now having two stages -- the 100-seat flexible Cripe Stage, and the 50-seat Fyda-Mar Stage.
- Kicked off an innovative summer education program, Speak Up Take a 'Chance'. This six-week program
  empowers junior high and high school students to find their voice and speak up, resulting in public performances
  of original pieces of theater that is completely written and produced by the students. The program has been
  offered for free for the past 12 years thanks to generous support from foundations and individuals.
- Advanced the core belief that theater is one of the last remaining forums for communities to come together. Through our post-show discussions (offered after every performance), complimentary audience events, and the 24hr Chance-a-thon, the Chance has made increasing efforts to create opportunities for our audiences to connect during this increasingly digital age.
- Partnered with various organizations, including Arts Orange County, Veterans First, and Heroes Hall, on
  producing the Veterans Initiative in the Arts. This six-week program brings together veterans from multiple wars,
  backgrounds and beliefs to bond, share stories, and begin the healing process for themselves and each other.

And what's next? More of the same -- bold and personal theatrical experiences, innovative education programs, new voices in the American theater landscape, and more opportunities for audiences to connect with the artists and with each other.

With a keen eye for character and an uncanny sense of humor, *Good People* explores the struggles, shifting loyalties, and unshakeable hope that comes with having next to nothing in America.

# 2018 RESIDENT PLAYWRIGHT

We are very proud to have Joanna as our 8th Resident Playwright. Her work has been developed nationally and internationally, including at the Banff Playwrights Colony, Tofte Lake Center, the New York and Hollywood Fringe Festivals, and many others. Her political drama about Iran, *The Orange Garden*, was a winner of the 2016 Keene Prize for Literature and included on the 2016 Kilroys List. An accomplished songwriter and musician, Joanna's original country musical, *100 Heartbreaks*, was workshopped in Seattle Rep's New Play Program, with the Northwest Playwrights Alliance, and was presented at the country's largest arts and culture festival, Bumbershoot. It was later nominated for an Austin Critics' Table Award for Outstanding Musical. Her short play, *Cat Cafe*, was a finalist for the 2017 Humana Festival of New Plays Heideman Award.

Joanna's daring spirit and skilled language makes her an emerging voice in the American theater landscape, and we are truly excited to support the development of her work for our 20th Anniversary Season.

In 2018, Joanna will have two of her shows featured in the OTR Series -- a staged reading of a brand new play that she's still writing, and a LAB Workshop of *The Orange Garden*.

### 2018 SEASON PRODUCERS BETTE & WYLIE AITKEN

True and hearty supporters of the Chance, we are honored to have Bette & Wylie Aitken return as Season Producers for our 2018 schedule.

The Aitkens played an integral role in helping the Chance move into its new home by contributing a major gift to the "Bold New Home" Capital Campaign. As an acknowledgement of their humbling support, the Chance officially named their new home the "Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center."

As *Coast Magazine* wrote, "Alone, Wylie is known for his legal prowess and keen litigation skills, but when he is with Bette, his wife of over 50 years, they are known as the power couple of philanthropy and the arts."

"When we first happened upon the Chance, it was already making a big impact in the community," said Bette and Wylie in a joint message. "And it appears that the ripple from that impact only continues to grow. Beyond the major works they produce on the stage, the Chance continues its mission of strengthening the bond between neighbors, fostering creativity in our children, and investing in the growth and development of local young and professional talent."

### ABOUT CHANCE THEATER

Proud to be one of the leading ensemble-driven theatre companies in Southern California, CHANCE THEATER recently received a National Theatre Company grant from American Theatre Wing. The Chance has won six Ovation Awards, including two for Best Production of a Musical – Intimate Theater for its West Coast premiere of *Triassic Parq – The Musical* and Southern California premiere of *Jerry Springer – The Opera*, as well as four LADCC Awards, including the Polly Warfield Award for Outstanding Season. The Anaheim City Council named Chance Theater "the official resident theater company of Anaheim", and Arts Orange County has twice named the Chance as "Outstanding Arts Organization". Known for using bold and personal storytelling to promote dialogue and connection within the Southern California theatrical landscape, the Chance is committed to contributing to a more compassionate, connected and creative community. As a constituent member of Theatre Communications Group, Network of Ensemble Theaters, and the LA Stage Alliance, Chance Theater continues to bring national attention to the Southern California and Orange County theater scenes.

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
