Chance Theater Extends the World Premiere of... Such Small Hands

From Workshop to World Premiere— A Love Story for the Aged!

Anaheim, CA — Chance Theater, Anaheim's official resident theater company, is thrilled to announce that its World Premiere production of *Such Small Hands* has been extended through March 30, 2025, due to overwhelming demand. Written by <u>Adam Szymkowicz</u> and directed by <u>Matthew McCray</u> (*Hedwig and The Angry Inch, Rent*), this highly anticipated new play—developed through Chance Theater's **On the Radar** (**OTR**) program—has captivated audiences, prompting an additional week of performances. Originally scheduled to run from February 28 to March 23, 2025, *Such Small Hands* will now continue through March 30, 2025, on the Fyda-Mar Stage at the Bette Aitken *theatre arts* Center. Previews began February 28, 2025.

Morning light. Black coffee. A quiet ritual shared by Paul and Marie—until the routine begins to slip. Paul is forgetting things—small things, at first. A name, a place, the way home. Yet through the uncertainty, there is laughter, tenderness, and a love that lingers in every glance, every touch, every memory. *Such Small Hands* is a poignant and unexpectedly humorous World Premiere about love, memory, and the delicate art of holding on.

Adam Szymkowicz, the inaugural resident playwright of Chance Theater's On the Radar (OTR) program, is celebrated for his remarkable ability to blend humor with profound humanity in his plays. His works resonate deeply with audiences across the nation, exploring both the humorous and mature aspects of the human experience. As a cornerstone of the OTR program, **Adam** has been instrumental in advancing its mission to develop and produce bold new works. His ability to engage and entertain while delivering a satisfyingly intelligent underpinning is a hallmark of his writing. His plays have been produced in the U.S. and in 22 other

countries, with thirty of his works published. He holds graduate degrees from Columbia University and Juilliard, and has conducted over 1,100 interviews with playwrights <u>on his blog</u>. Two of his plays have been featured as NY Times Critic's Picks, further cementing his reputation as a leading voice in contemporary theater.

Such Small Hands features an exceptional cast, with <u>Bruce Goodrich</u> (OTR: Such Small Hands) in the role of Paul and <u>Juliet Fischer</u> (Chance Debut) as Marie.

Director **Matthew McCray** shares his enthusiasm for the production, stating: "*Such Small Hands* is a rich and beautiful play that explores the humor, depth, and love that emerges from a long marriage. I am thrilled to delve into this meaningful and brave story about commitment and a long life, well-lived. It's a poignant reminder of the extraordinary within the ordinary and the resilience that comes with love and connection."

The talented creative team for *Such Small Hands* includes **Ganymede Projects** as Scenic and Costume Designers, <u>Azra King-Abadi</u> (Chance Debut) as Lighting Designer, and <u>Darryl B. Hovis</u> (Chance Resident Artist, OCTG Winner for Outstanding Sound Design) as Sound Designer. The production is Stage Managed by <u>Jordyn Nieblas-Galvan</u> (Chance Debut), with Casting by <u>Shinshin Yuder Tsai</u> (Chance Resident Artist).

Proud to be one of the leading ensemble-driven theatre companies in Southern California, Chance Theater has received the National Theatre Company grant from American Theatre Wing for "nurturing a community of artists in ways that strengthen and demonstrate the quality, diversity, and dynamism of American theatre." Morning light filters through the kitchen window.

Marie brews the coffee-black. Paul asks for sugar. Marie says the sugar is out of reach. So they drink it black.

Paul wonders, "Do we drink it black because the sugar is out of reach or because we like it that way?"

For Paul and Marie, a lifetime of love is woven into these small rituals, their days filled with playful quibbles, knowing glances, and the gentle rhythm of routine. But lately, those routines are shifting. Paul is forgetting things—small things, at first. A name, a place, the way home.

And yet, through the confusion and the loss, there is still love. There is still laughter. There is still Marie, holding Paul's hands in hers, reminding him of the life they built together.

From Chance Theater's 2011 Resident Playwright Adam Szymkowicz, this world premiere is a heart-wrenching and unexpectedly humorous meditation on memory, devotion, and what it truly means to hold on – to the past, to each other, and to the fleeting beauty of now.
