Chance Theater proudly presents the regional premiere of... *The Chinese Lady*

Discover the untold story of the first Chinese woman to set foot in America

ANAHEIM, CA – Chance Theater, Anaheim's official resident theater company, is thrilled to announce the regional premiere of *The Chinese Lady*, written by **Lloyd Suh** and directed by Chance Producing Associate, **Shinshin Yuder Tsai**. Inspired by a true story, Lloyd Suh's critically acclaimed play is a poetic, whimsical tale that paints a unique portrait of the United States as seen through the eyes of this remarkable young Chinese woman. Running **May 24 to June 8, 2025** at the Bette Aitken *theater arts* Center's Cripe Stage, with previews beginning May 16, 2025!

The Chinese Lady follows 14-year-old Afong Moy, the first Chinese woman to set foot in America, after she has sailed into New York Harbor to be featured in a museum. She sees herself as a representative of China, here to educate and entertain. Or, in the eyes of the paying public, is she merely a mesmerizing display? Moving and sharply funny, this play follows the idealistic Moy as she travels through America as a living exhibit for decades. Over the course of her travels, Moy shares her impressions of a young country struggling to define itself.

This production of *The Chinese Lady* offers a timely exploration of the complexities of identity, representation, and the immigrant experience. Afong Moy, the first Chinese woman in America, was presented to the American public as both an object of fascination and a symbol of the distant and mysterious East. In Lloyd Suh's gripping play, we witness the personal and emotional toll of being both a cultural ambassador and a living spectacle. Through Afong's journey, Suh thoughtfully examines the intersection of race, gender, and power in early American society, revealing how her story remains relevant to ongoing conversations about who gets to define culture and whose voices are heard. As Afong confronts the painful isolation of being seen but not understood, *The Chinese Lady* challenges us to reflect on the ways history has shaped—and continues to shape—the narratives of marginalized communities. The play forces us to

reconsider the cost of representation, both for those who are visible and those who remain invisible.

The Chinese Lady features an exceptional cast, with <u>Michelle Krusiec</u> (International Tour of *Chinglish* & Netflix's *Hollywood*) in the role of Afong Moy and <u>Albert Park</u> (Geffen Playhouse's *Man of God*) as Atung, with <u>Amanda Kang</u> (Chance Debut) and <u>Kaixiang Zhang</u> (Chance Debut) serving as their respective understudies.

Director **Tsai** shares his excitement about the production, stating: "It's a show about being watched, but it's a play about being seen...*The Chinese Lady* is a powerful and timely story that...asks us to confront prejudice, to see past harmful preconceptions, and to connect with one another. It is filled with humor, poetry, and theatricality, bringing history to life in a way that feels both intimate and epic...History made her a spectacle, but this story gives her a voice...I feel honored to direct this production and am committed to sharing [Afong Moy's] story with the care and reverence it deserves."

The talented creative team includes <u>Christopher Scott Murillo</u> (*Gloria*) as Scenic Designer, <u>Grace</u> <u>Kim</u> (Chance Debut) as Costume Designer, <u>Masako Tobaru</u> (Chance Resident Artist) as Lighting Designer, <u>Bebe Herrera</u> (Chance Resident Artist) as Stage Manager, <u>Natalia Duong</u> (*Colonialism is Terrible, But Phở is Delicious*) as Dramaturg, **Jerry Zou** (Chance Debut) and **Nico Pang** (Chance Debut) as Assistant Directors, <u>Shinshin Yuder Tsai</u> (Chance Resident Casting Director) as Casting Director, and **Fae Crane** (*Fancy Nancy, The Musical*) as Casting Associate.

About The Playwright: Lloyd Suh

Lloyd Suh (he/him) is the author of *The Chinese Lady, Charles Francis Chan Jr.'s Exotic Oriental Murder Mystery, American Hwangap, The Wong Kids in the Secret of the Space Chupacabra Go!, Jesus in India*, and others, produced with Ma-Yi, Magic Theatre, EST, NAATCO, PlayCo, Denver Center, Milwaukee Rep, ArtsEmerson, Children's Theatre Co, and more, including internationally at the Cultural Center of the Philippines and with PCPA in Seoul, Korea. He has received support from the NEA Arena Stage New Play Development program, Mellon Foundation, NYFA, NYSCA, Jerome, TCG, Dramatists Guild, and residencies including NYS&F and Ojai. He is an alum of Youngblood and the Soho Rep Writer/Director Lab, and was a recipient of a 2016 Helen Merrill Award and the 2019 Herb Alpert Award in the Arts. From 2005-2010 he served as Artistic Director of Second Generation and Co-Director of the Ma-Yi Writers Lab, and has served since 2011 as the Director of Artistic Programs at The Lark, and since 2015 as a member of the Dramatists Guild Council.

About our Director: Shinshin Yuder Tsai

Shinshin Yuder Tsai is the Producing Associate at Chance Theater, where he also serves as the Resident Intimacy and Casting Director. He is a Board Member-Council for OCTG and the Founding Artistic Director of the AAPI Sketch Comedy Troupe, No MSG Added.

His directing credits span a wide range of acclaimed productions, including *She Kills Monsters* at Long Beach Playhouse & STAGEStheatre, *The Hatmaker's Wife, LOVE/SICK*, and *Cowboy Vs. Samurai* at Long Beach Playhouse, as well as *The Pillowman* and *Almost, Maine* at the University of California, Irvine. At Chapman University, he has directed *Metamorphoses* and *Mother Courage and Her Children*. His production of *Kvetcher in the Wry* was a standout at OC-Centric, and he directed the 2024 OCTG Award Shows at the Segerstrom Center for the Arts, with plans to direct the 2025 Award Show.

As an intimacy director, Shinshin has worked to ensure that performers feel safe and respected in their craft. His intimacy direction credits include the upcoming *Spring Awakening* and 2024's *Sweeney Todd, The Demon Barber of Fleet Street* at Chance Theater, *Unbroken Blossom* at East West Players, and productions of *Vietgone* and *Peter and the Starcatcher* at the University of California, Riverside.

Shinshin is also dedicated to the development of new theatrical works. He has collaborated on projects such as *Boat Show* by Dustin H. Chinn, *saving all my worries till the day you don't need me* and *Multiple Loads* by Nicholas Pilapil, and *The Lantern Bearer* and *Shanghai Express* by Aj Layague.

Outside of his artistic pursuits, Shinshin has curated an extensive list of All-You-Can-Eat restaurants across Southern California, with a passion for food that rivals his dedication to theater arts.
