## **Christopher and Beth**

**Beth**: For God's sake, Christopher, he's learning it for her. It's got nothing to do with

Gateshead! This is about him, and her, and nobody else. Can we all stop being so possessive? People do things for people they love. (She gestures irritably at

the kimono she has on.) Like me. Wearing a bloody kimono!

**Christopher**: Exactly my point! It's like a marriage. It's not a marriage if its open. Is it. "Unless

it's me and only me, it's not love." "Forsaking all others." Like any cult, it's

founded on exclusion. A sect has to have enemies and--

**Beth**: "Sect!" For God's sake.

**Christopher**: OK. Maybe I shouldn't say sect. Cult? Is cult better? The feeling of persecution is

built in--

**Beth**: Who are they persecuting?

take your hearing aids out and shove them up your arse. The feeling of

persecution is necessary because it bonds--

**Beth**: / Can we just leave it? Billy doesn't feel persecuted--

Christopher: I'm not talking about Billy, Billy's not deaf--

Beth: Billy is deaf-

**Christopher**: He is not, he's been brought up in a hearing family, he's been protected from all

that shit! I'm talking about the hardliners, capital-D Deaf, the people who call us

Audists.

**Beth**: You have no idea if this girl is a hardliner or not! All he's doing is learning another

language! You gave Hayley a hard time for being Northern, and now you're giving

this girl a hard time for signing! No one is ever good enough, are they!

**Christopher**: Making deafness the center of your identity is the beginning of the end. Like

being a Northerner. When your flaw is made part of your personality.
