Building Bridges of Reconnection with *Edges*

In a span of a little over a decade, Benj Pasek and Justin Paul have had a meteoric rise to musical stardom that spans the mediums of theater, film, and television. Be it their renowned Tony Award-winning musical Dear Evan Hansen, their Oscar-nominated songs in the films La La Land or The Greatest Showman, or their lauded Off-Broadway hit *Dogfight*, Pasek and Paul have quickly become household names amongst the musical theater community. Edges takes us back to the beginnings of this already-iconic duo, their very first collaboration penned at the age of nineteen while attending the musical theater program at the University of Michigan in 2005. The musical garnered the pair the American Theatre Wing's 2007 Jonathan Larson Grant, and they continue to hold the record for the youngest recipients to have ever won the award.

The show is a song cycle; a series of musical performances connected in sequence by a common theme. Its flexibility in its structure, cast, and staging possibilities have proven ideal for college theatre departments, having been staged in over thirty U.S. universities. Its first professional production was at the Capital Repertory Theatre in Albany, New York. The show has since been performed over one hundred times and has been staged internationally, including Australia, Canada, England, France, the Philippines, and South Africa.

Though Pasek and Paul wrote Edges primarily as a response to their dissatisfaction with the roles they were assigned in musical theater productions while in college, this coming-of-age show encompasses a vast array of experiences that are profoundly relatable. With its witty and emotional songs, it remains representative of specific moments

in adulthood and young adulthood where one finds themselves teetering on the "edge" between various aspects of identity – whether it be figuring out who we become, how we relate to others, how we express affection, or who we truly are at our core.

One of the foremost themes of the play is centered around human connection. This is visible in the pains of shifting sisterly bonds in the song "Caitlyn and Haley," as well as the struggles of knowing when it's appropriate to say the big "L" word in "I Hmm You." It is also present in the anthems dedicated to ditching small talk and embracing living the fullest life imaginable in the songs "Coasting" and "Ready to be Loved."

In reflecting how the past year forced all of us to find innovative new ways to connect with one another via new and existing means of social media despite widespread isolation, there is perhaps no better show to celebrate the strength of human connection in this show, which marks the Chance's return to live, in-person theater. I can't think of a better narrative to be sharing with our Orange County community right now as a part of a season of theater dedicated to welcoming us back into a space of shared experience. So here's to figuring out what we have yet to become, and here's to reconnection!

Benj Pasek & Justin Paul (Music & Lyrics) Oscar, Grammy, Tony, and Golden Globe Award-winning songwriters Benj Pasek & Justin Paul are best known for their work on *Dear Evan Hansen, La La Land*, and *The*

Greatest Showman. Their songs "City of Stars" and "Audition (The Fools Who Dream)" from La La Land (with collaborator Justin Hurwitz) were both nominated for the Academy Award for Best Original Song, and "City of Stars" garnered both the Academy Award and Golden Globe for Best Original Song in a Motion Picture. Pasek & Paul won the 2018 Golden Globe for Best Original Song for "This Is Me" from The Greatest Showman, which was also nominated for the 2018 Academy Award for Best Original Song and most recently for the 2019 Grammy Award for Best Song Written for Visual Media. Upcoming projects include the live-action movie musicals Aladdin and Snow White at Disney, and an original animated musical at Fox Animation/Blue Sky Studios. On Broadway they composed the score for the six-time Tony Awardwinning Dear Evan Hansen, their highly acclaimed original musical for which they received an Obie Award, a Drama Desk Award, and the Tony Award for Best Score. The Dear Evan Hansen Original Broadway Cast Recording won the 2018 Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album, and The Greatest Showman Original Motion Picture Soundtrack, which was recently nominated for the 2019 Grammy Award for Best Compilation Soundtrack for Visual Media, is certified Platinum in over a dozen countries, including Double Platinum in the US, Australia, and Taiwan, Triple Platinum in Ireland and Singapore, and Quadruple Platinum in the UK and Korea. Pasek & Paul had their Broadway debut in 2012 with their Tony-nominated score for the Broadway musical A Christmas Story, an adaptation of the classic holiday film, further adapted into a live telecast for FOX in 2017. Their new song written for the telecast, "In the Market for a Miracle," was nominated for the 2018 Emmy for Outstanding Original Music and Lyrics. In 2013, they contributed several songs to NBC's Smash, and received great acclaim for their musical Dogfight which was awarded Off-Broadway's highest honor, the

Among their numerous honors, in 2007 they became the youngest winners ever of the famed Jonathan Larson Award for most promising musical theater songwriters. Both are graduates of the University of Michigan Musical Theatre Program and currently serve on the Board of Directors for the Dramatists Guild Foundation.

Marc Sanford (Associate House Manager) is very happy to be a Chance Theater Resident Artist and Associate House Manager. In 1994, Marc did a production of Little Shop of Horrors at Rancho Santiago College

(now known as Santa Ana College), where he met future Chance founders Oanh Nguven and Jeff Hellebrand. Marc first performed at the Chance in A History of the American Film as Mickey (plus 4 other characters) and soon became a resident artist. In 2004. Marc had to drop out of the company due to the discovery of a tumor about the size of a ping-pong ball on his optic nerve. His surgery was successful, but he

moved up to the Seattle area to stay with family to recuperate. While he was up there, he attended the Seattle Film Institute where he received a Filmmaking Certificate. Marc has been a resident artist since 2008.

Chance Theater is proud to be one of the leading ensemble-driven theatre companies in Southern California, having recently received the National Theatre Company grant from American Theatre Wing for "nurturing a community of artists in ways that strengthen and demonstrate the guality, diversity, and dynamism of American theatre." The Chance recently won the Ovation Award for Best Production of a Musical (Intimate Theatre) for their intimate production of Fun Home. Previously, the Chance had won seven Ovation Awards, including three others for Best Production of a Musical (Intimate Theatre) for its regional premiere of Lizzie, The Musical, the West Coast premiere of Triassic Parg - The Musical, and Southern California premiere of Jerry Springer - The Opera, as well as four LADCC Awards, including the Polly Warfield Award for Outstanding Season. The Anaheim City Council named Chance Theater "the Official Resident Theater Company of Anaheim" in 2014, and Arts Orange County has twice named the Chance as "Outstanding Arts Organization." Known for using bold and personal storytelling to promote dialogue and connection within the Southern California theatrical landscape, the Chance is committed to contributing to a more compassionate, connected and creative community. As a constituent member of Theatre Communications Group, The Theatrical Producers League of Los Angeles, and OC Theatre Guild, Chance Theater continues to bring national attention to the Southern California and Orange County theater scenes.
